

ESTATE OF ELIZABETH H. BATES.

University of Michigan Has Accepted
the Terms of the Will.

WHITE PLAINS, N. Y., June 20.—Surrogate Silkman of Westchester County to-day received the transfer tax report on the estate of Dr. Elizabeth H. Bates, who died at Port Chester, April 6, 1898. Burton C. Meighan, the appraiser, reports that the decedent left personal property amounting to \$104,184.05, and real estate valued at \$9,500.

The will of Dr. Bates, after giving a legacy of \$139 to Miss Edith Milford, of Bradford, Penn., and an annuity of \$1,200 a year to an aunt, Miss Mary A. Hanners, bequeaths both real and personal estate to the University of Michigan for the use of the medical department to found a professorship to be known as the Bates Professorship of the Diseases of Women and Children. The bequest was made on condition that the university receive female students and give them the same advantages as male students. The university has accepted the terms of the will.
