Leaves \$4,168 to Hall of Fame An unusual legacy has been received by the National Baseball Hall of Fame and Museum, Inc. By terms of the will of Isaac Newton Falk, who died in New York City, June 18, 1954, one-fourth share of the residuary estate was awarded baseball's historic shrine.

Two checks drawn by Barnett Levy as executor of the Falk estate, one totaling \$4,168.61, the other for 63 cents, have been forwarded to the Baseball Hall of Fame.

Officials of the Cooperstown shrine were pleasantly surprised when they were informed of the terms of Ike Falk's will. In a few words, an enthusiastic baseball fan remained a baseball fan right down to the last put out, so to speak.

Through an unusual quirk, Ike Falk changed from his bleacher seat to the grandstand as the guest of Ford C. Frick, then president of the National League. An eager-beaver on all baseball affairs, Falk detected an error in the National League schedule for the 1936 season.

Another feature opening night was a camel race. Substitute jockeys had to be found for the ships of the desert when owner Gene Holter disqualified three men originally scheduled to ride.
