MORRIS — Since the new ambulance has been displayed at the Four Corners in Morris, for public inspection Saturday, the Fund drive is a success. Although firm commitment will be closed on Saturday, November 7, members of the Emergency Squad in Morris will continue on working for the Fund Drive.

William Pickens, captain, said that members of the fund raising committee are now working

on house to house visit to all residents of Morris, New Lisbon, West Laurens, part of Carratsville and some outside residents in the area.

The desired ambulance is a 1962 Cadillac and has a capacity of two stretcher patients and one ambulatory patient. It has much more work room and head space. Its price is \$5800 and committee workers hope to meet the cost before the closing date. If this is not possible, William
