

## Morris emergency unit opens fund campaign

MORRIS — Miss Evelyn Kinney, cashier of the First National Bank of Morris has accepted the position of treasurer for the Morris Emergency Squad Ambulance Fund Drive which will begin this week.

The goal for this drive will be \$6,500 to purchase a 1966 Cadillac ambulance and a firm commitment on this must be made by November 30.

William R. Pickens, fund chairman for the emergency squad said that the Morris Fire Department members and the Rotary Club of Morris have offered assistance in this drive. Also, letters are being mailed to all residents of the Fire District stating that an average donation of \$12 per family would enable the squad to purchase this newer ambulance but emphasized that all will not be able to give the average and that others may give more to reach this goal.

The Morris Emergency Squad was formed in October of 1963 and, to date, has answered 429 calls and donated more than 8,500 man hours. The work of

an emergency squad is volunteer and free of charge and the Morris squad has 12 members, all holding Advance First Aid — A.R.C. cards.
