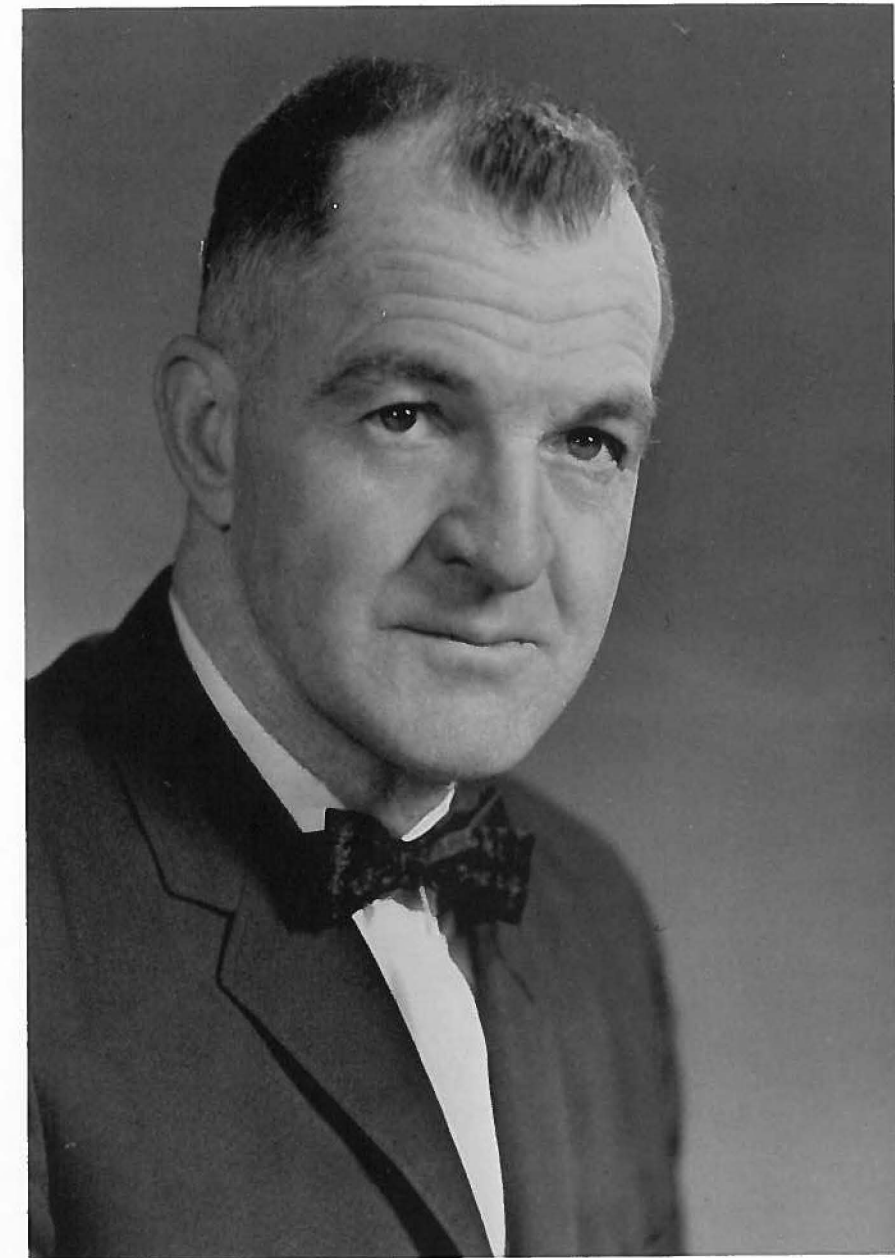
## *Principal's Message*

Williams scored from 30 yards out, from one yard and from the 14 in his great afternoon best he's ever had at Morris according to coach John Dima.

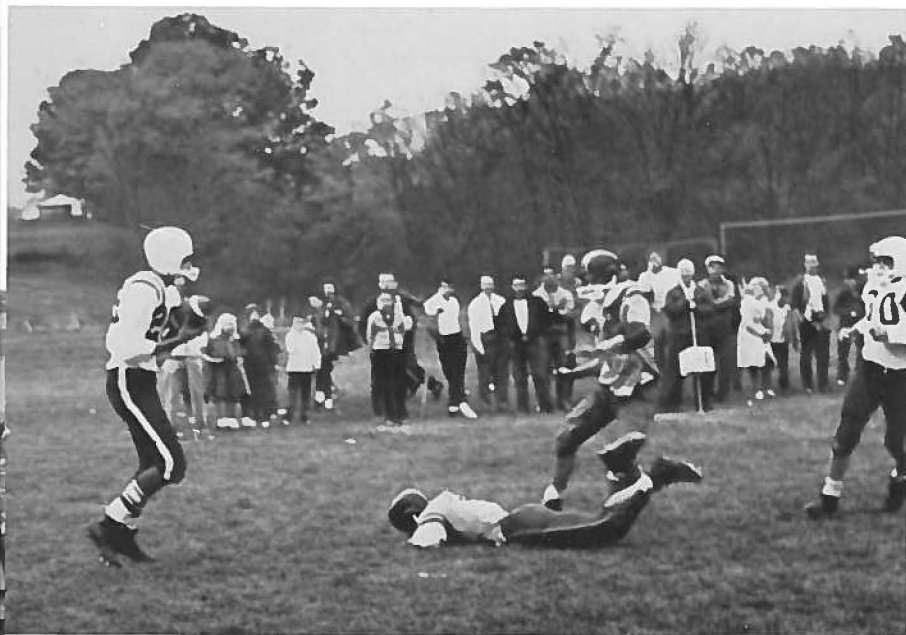
Paul Kogut scored from seven in the fourth quarter for Morris.

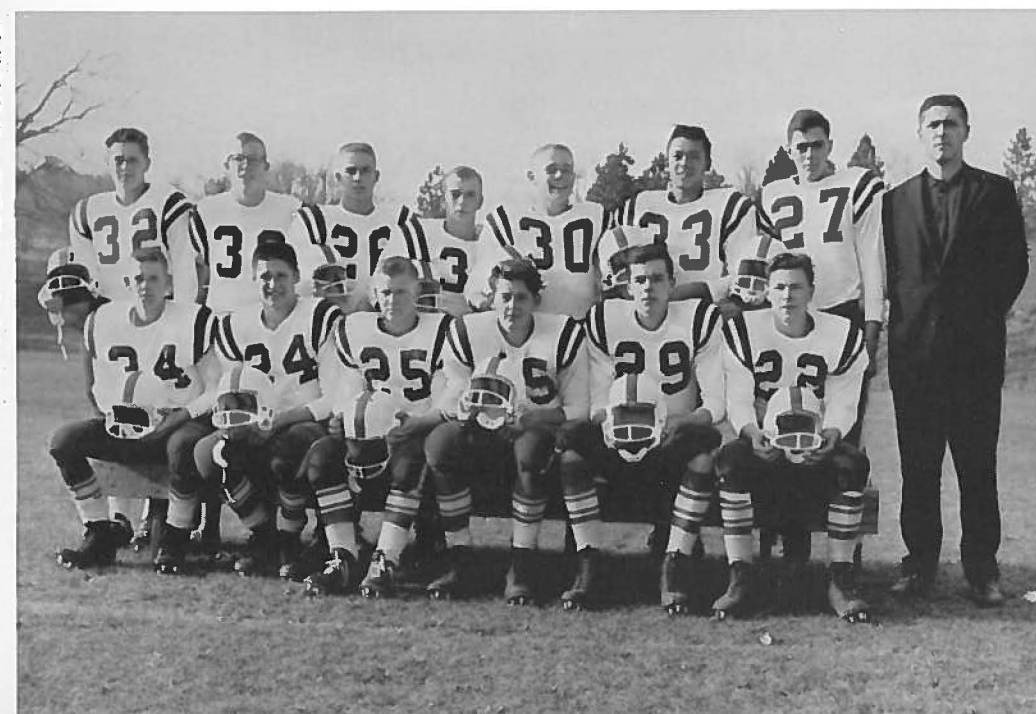
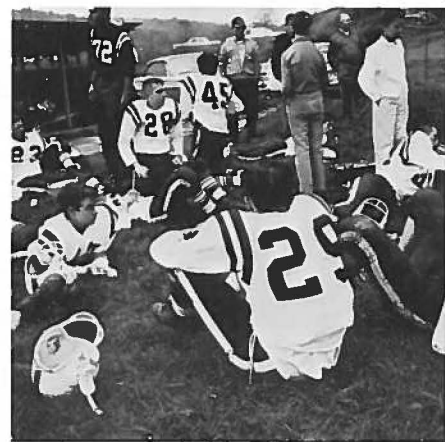
Both clubs scored in the third period, Morris when Howie Elliott got away for a 50 yard touchdown print. Doug George added the point which turned out to be the margin of victory.

## Morris Club Too Speedy For Edmeston

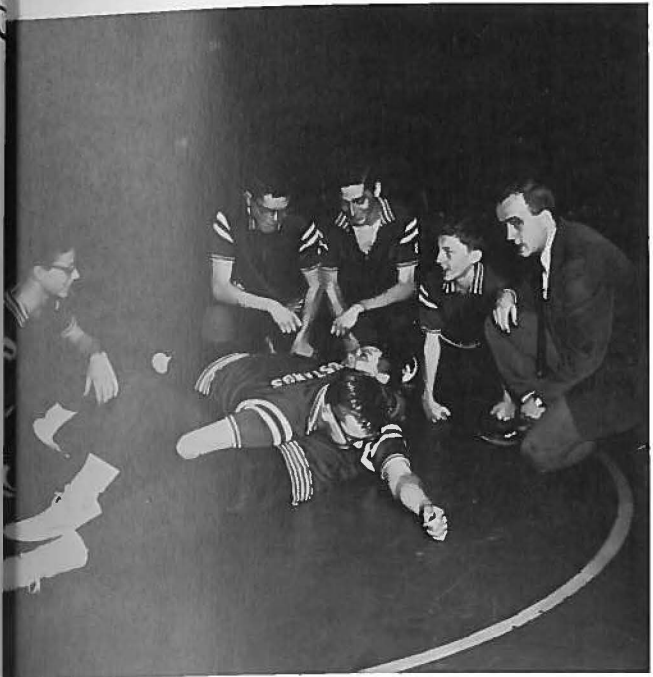

The win moved Morris, with a 2-1 record, into first place in the division. Edmeston has a 1 win; 1 tied, and 1 lost record.

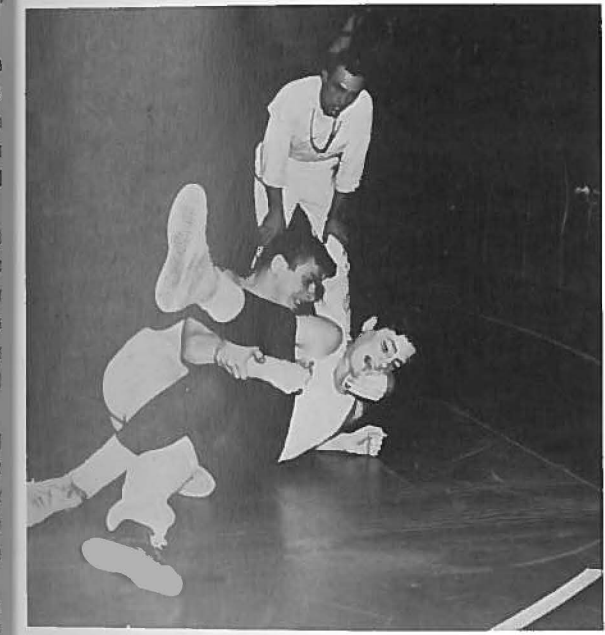
