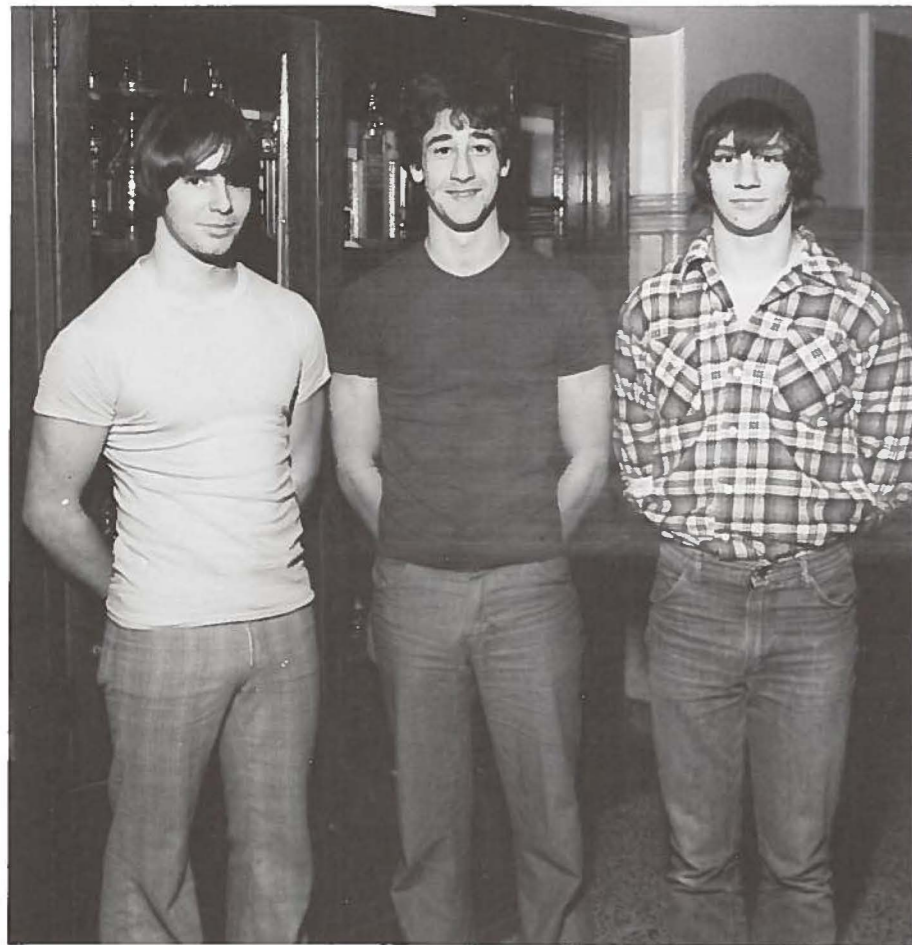
## Mustang Effort Pays Off!
