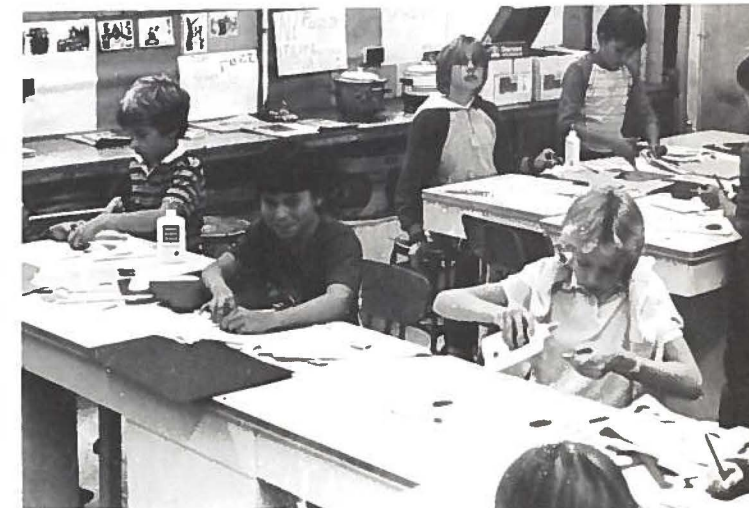

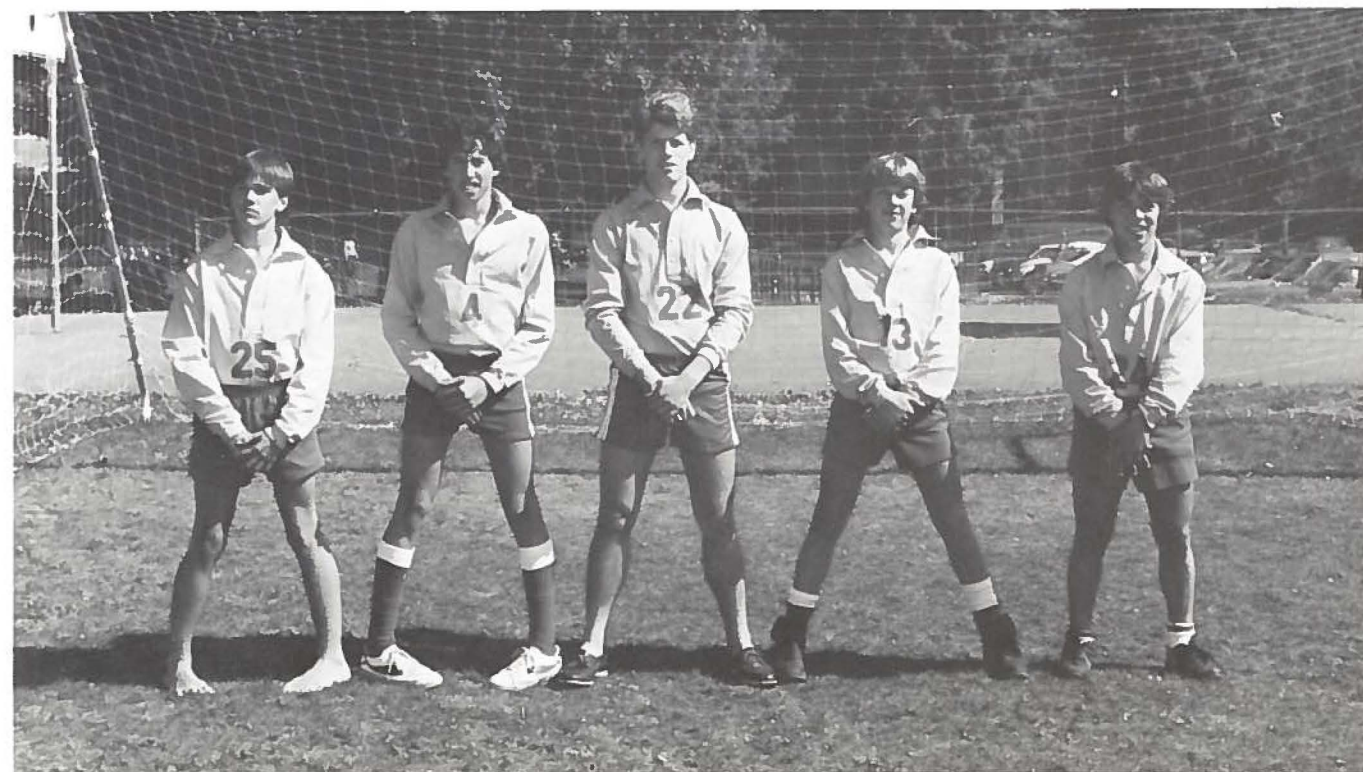
SOFTBALL
