Question: "I've heard that in some cases, I don't even have to file. Who actually must file by law?"
Answer: "If you are single and your income for the year is less than \$3,300, in most cases you are not required to file. If you can be claimed as a dependent on your parents return and you have \$1,000 or more income from dividends and interest, you must file. A married couple filing jointly, under 65 years of age, is not required to file if income is less than \$5,400, age spouse over 65, \$6,400, both over 65, \$7,400."
