

In August, 1867, one Gilbert Rogers was arrested for shooting John De Forest, in Unadilla. The parties were farmers and neighbors. Rogers was discharged on the plea of accident. Immediately after he went to the West, where he has remained until this Spring, when he returned to Unadilla, and his re-arrest followed. He is now confined in the Jail in this village.

An indictment for murder was found at the October term, last year, and recently, we understand, District Attorney Edick has been down to Unadilla to personally inspect the ground where De Forest was killed, and has ordered a complete survey and maps of the same to be made. Rogers' trial will take place at the June term, of the Oyer and Terminer.
