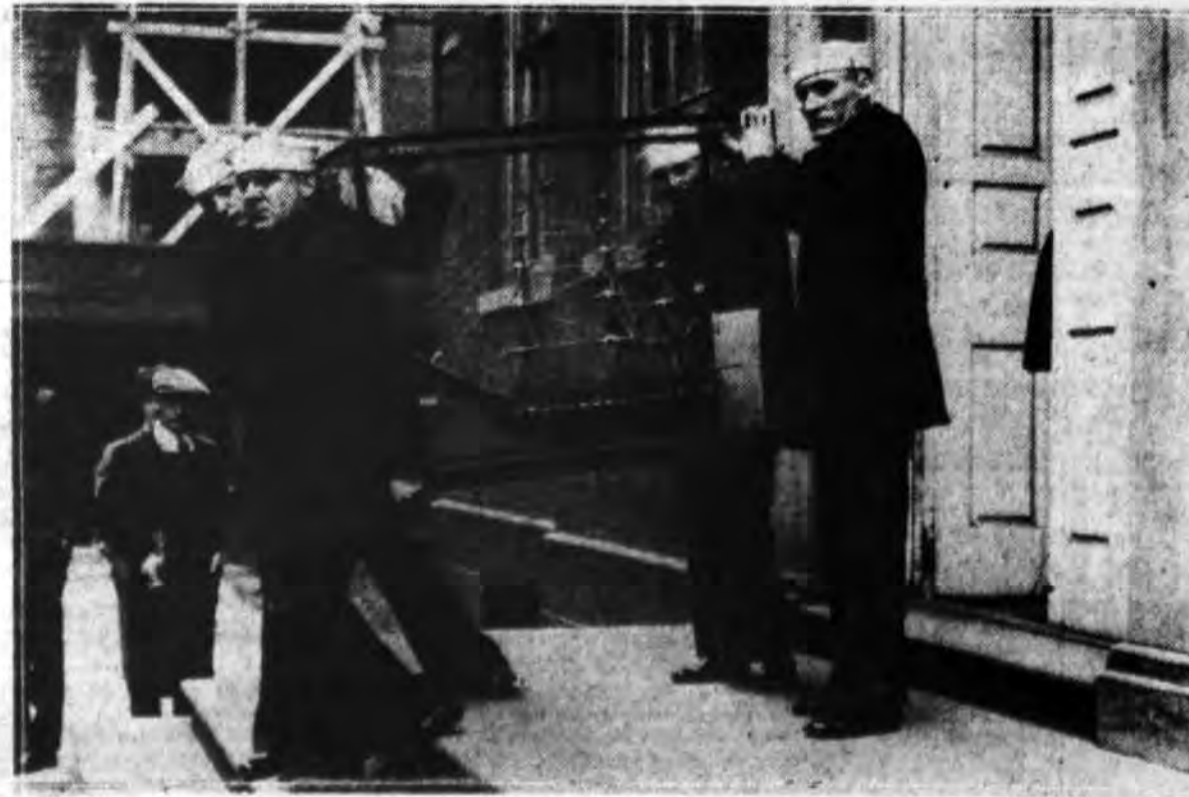


MAKES SPECTACULAR LEAP
