**"Lost Baby" Case Dropped**

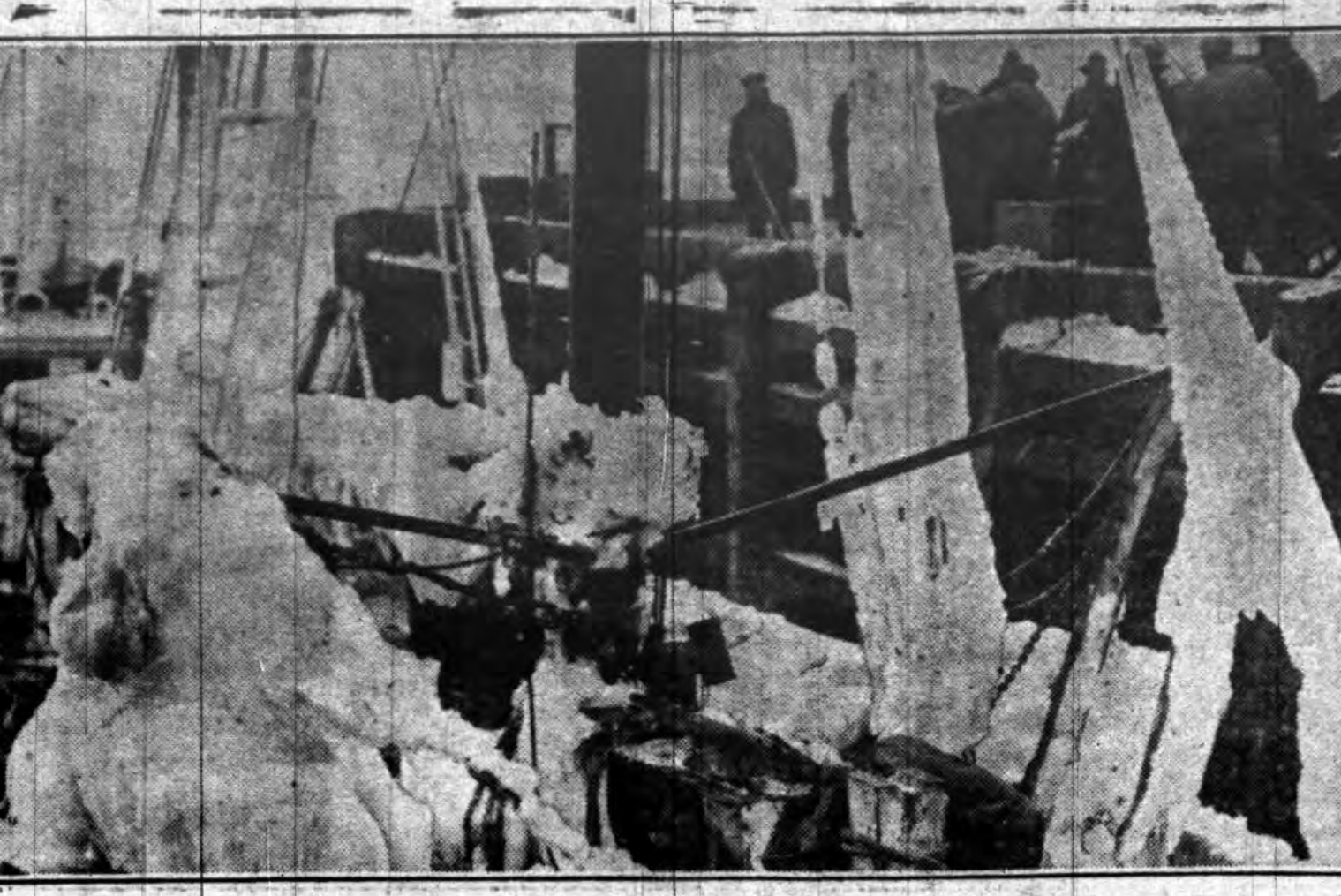

**Jack Pickford Dies In Paris**

PARIS, Jan. 4.—Jack Pickford, who grew up with the motion picture industry under the aegis of his famous sister Mary, died today in the American Hospital with none of his relatives present.

Death came to the former actor at 4 p. m. as a result of a combination of diseases. He suffered a nervous breakdown last October, when he entered the institution, and since had frequently expressed his unwillingness to live longer.

Pickford was born at Toronto, Ont., and was 36 years old when he died. All his three wives were from Ziegfeld productions. He first married Olive Thomas, screen star, in 1921. She died while they were on their honeymoon in Paris, strangely enough in the same hospital where Pickford died.
