

## DEVOTEES OF THE LOCOMOBILE WILL SPEED TO ATLANTIC CITY

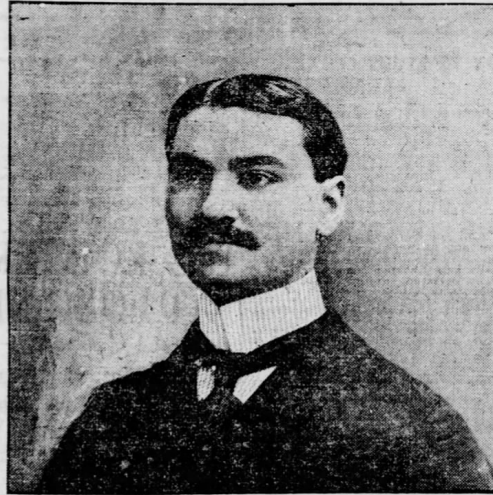
Members of the Philadelphia Locomobile Club Make Their Initial Run This Afternoon—Over Fifty Horseless Vehicles to Start.  
Return Trip to Be Made To-morrow

The Philadelphia Locomobile Club—now about a week old—will hold its initial run this afternoon. They start for Atlantic City, to remain over Sunday, and a large number of owners of locomobiles, automobiles and all kinds of horseless vehicles will participate.

This club owes its origin to Dr. S. Leon Gans and several other prominent North Philadelphians. A meeting for organization was held on Tuesday of last week, and while no club officers were elected, the constitution and necessary preparations were made. The dues, it was decided, were to be very moderate, and all owners of horseless carriages throughout the city were invited to join. Thus far, quite a number have responded and the club now bids fair to become a permanent success.

Early this week arrangements were perfected for the club's initial run. It was decided that they start for Atlantic City this afternoon, and the participants will meet at half-past 12 at 138 North Broad street. It is likely that nearly fifty horseless carriages will be in the run. No entrance fee is to be charged and the club extends a cordial invitation to all owners of horseless carriages to participate. Barring delays the trip will be made in four hours. While at Atlantic City the party will be quartered at the Waldorf-Astoria. Returning, the club will leave Atlantic City at 2 o'clock Sunday afternoon, arriving here at about 6.

Next week arrangements for obtaining a permanent club house will be perfected. The pacemakers on this initial trip will be Messrs. Taxis, Goodman, Thayer and Dr. Middleton. Those in charge of the run are: Messrs. Plummer, Thayer, Taxis, Goodman, Clayton, Smith, Rudolph, Elwood, Hurley, Strausser, Goldsmith, Gans, Middleton, Douglass, Good and Barton. Dr. S. Leon Gans has been appointed the captain for the run, and Maurice B. Thayer, roadmaster.
