

Captain Roy Bolig Back From Overseas

Captain Roy V. Bolig, veteran of seven invasions in the Mediterranean, is visiting here with his wife, the former Miss Lillian Corgeau, of Holyoke, Mass., at the home of his brother and sister-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. Harold L. Bolig, of University Heights.

Captain Bolig is the son of Mrs. Luther M. Bolig, of Sunbury, and the late Mr. Bolig who formerly resided in Selinsgrove.

He enlisted as a private in the Army Air Force in April, 1941, flew to England by way of Greenland and Scotland and in November, 1942, went to Africa, where he was commissioned a second lieutenant on the field of battle. He took part in campaigns in Sicily and Italy, advancing twice in commissions. His unit flew C-46 planes, transporting paratroopers and towing gliders, evacuating wounded and handling supplies.

Captain Bolig was a four letter man at Selinsgrove High School, and was also prominent in athletics at other schools he attended, which included Wenonah Military Academy, Penn State and Susquehanna University. His wife, whom he married while stationed in New England, is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. A. Corgeau, of Holyoke. His brother, Harold L. Bolig, is a veteran of overseas service in the American Red Cross and is now principal of the Selinsgrove Junior High School.

On Monday Captain Bolig will report to the Redistribution center in Atlantic City for further assignment.
